In Australia we remember Anzac day,

but elsewhere this camellia is one of a series with the name "April" included, which comes from its Japanese origins, where it is celebrated and remembered during the month of April for its stunning blooms and cultural significance, and the onset of spring. One of the famous places Camellia japonica flower in April is the Camellia Forest of *Toshogu Shrine in Nikko, Japan*, which is home to over 5,000 camellia trees, some 500 years old. People participate in Hanami, a Japanese tradition of flower viewing, which includes the camellia. In Japan, Camellia is considered a symbol of wealth and perfection, used in religious and tea ceremonies.

Shrines are decorated with camellias and blossom during April to pay respects to deities or to pray for good fortune, love, and fertility.

Hope to see you at the next meeting, with lots of blooms!



Camellias are sometimes said to represent business success, virtue, happiness, fidelity, luxury, tastefulness, and a life concluding in the ease of retirement. But that is in great part a modern imposition or overlay, because formerly the camellia, akin to cherry blossoms (which symbolized evanescence), was symbolic of a short life lived in a blaze of glory, or in faithfulness to a lord even in the face of sure death."

## Planting and Fertilizing in April


#### PLANT SPRING FLOWERING BULBS
